RE: Microwave Procedure

Prior to the Urologix / Targis procedure performed by Dr. Genvert on July 11, 2006, I was taking Flomax on a daily basis, getting up for bathroom breaks every 2 to 3 hours practically every night, and having to plan restroom breaks while on auto trips, shopping, at restaurants, or at social functions. My urinary dysfunctions included dribbling, unable to void my bladder (about 300 cc remained), short bursts while voiding, difficulty initiating stream flow, extreme urgency that many times lead to accidents by not being able to get to a restroom in time, and weak stream flow.

All of these conditions are now history. I stopped taking Flomax about 10 days after the procedure. Looking back, the above conditions started to fade away just a few days following the procedure to a total elapse two months later. Here in December, 2006, I do not experience any of these conditions and feel as I did about twenty years ago. And yes, I am able to sleep 8 to 10 hour a night without getting awake.

As I had talked to several retired friends, they have never heard of the microwave treatment called Targis. Their knowledge is of the older surgical and laser treatments which have not been too successful. I suggest that the physicians hold seminars explaining not only the benefits of this procedure but the practical aspects during and following the procedure. Many of the questions that I receive are about the amount of pain during the procedure, the resulting corrective condition following the procedure, and, of course, sexual capability.

Having been a software engineer, I immediately questioned the required input parameters that Ms. Glenda Wilkinson at Urologix referred to during my search to understand the physical aspects of the procedure. Follow-up Q & A with her eventually led me to Dr. Genvert, whom she speaks quite highly. The urologists here in the Venice, FL area do not understand the need for a cystoscopy prior to the procedure. Of course, as you and I know, the cysto is the only way to measure the length of the urethra passing through the prostate gland that determines selection of the style of catheter to be used.

I was impressed, not only by Dr. Genvert, but by the nursing staff and the entire office folks who contribute to the overall impression of the group. If you haven't done so, please pass my gratitude to all for the new life style that this procedure has provided.
